

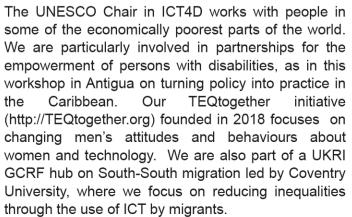
Digitally empowering poor people and marginalised communities through outstanding research
